

# 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Reading Session Saturday, March 21, 2015, 11:00 am – 1:30 pm Heinz Hall

LAWRENCE LOH and FAWZI HAIMOR, Conductors MASON BATES, PSO Composer of the Year Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra

Submission receipt deadline: November 20, 2014

Since the 2004-2005 season, the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra has offered an annual reading of works by young composers from area universities as part of its Composer of the Year program. Beginning in 2012, the PSO's annual reading program expanded its call for submissions to residents of Pennsylvania\*. Up to four works will be selected for the reading session, where at least one of the spots will be reserved for a student from the universities that have traditionally participated in the program.

Submissions will be evaluated by Mason Bates, and read by the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra conducted by Lawrence Loh and Fawzi Haimor, PSO Resident Conductors. The event is free and open to the general public. Following the session, composers will receive feedback from a panel including Mason Bates, Lawrence Loh and Fawzi Haimor, and PSO musicians.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicants must be residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at the time of submission.
- Applicants must be composers in the early stages of their professional careers.
- Previous participants may not reapply.
- Only one work per composer will be considered.
- Submitted works may not have received a performance or a reading by a professional orchestra.

## **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

- The deadline for score submission is November 20, 2014.
- The work may be up to 10 minutes in length.
- The work must be for Orchestra only; concertos or works with electronic elements will not be considered.
- Instrumentation shall not exceed the guidelines provided below.
- Incomplete, illegible, or late submissions will not be considered. If selected, composers must provide professional, legible scores and orchestral parts prepared according to guidelines established by the Major Orchestral Librarians Association (MOLA). The only exception to MOLA guidelines is the size of the score; sizes other than 10x13 will also be accepted.
- The quality of the score submitted is the primary evaluation criteria.

<sup>\*</sup> As part of an ongoing partnership, submissions from the West Virginia University will continue to be accepted.

#### INSTRUMENTATION

3-3-3-3 4-3-3-1 tmp+3, harp, strings and piano Standard orchestral doublings are permitted.

## Please note that percussion shall not exceed:

Bass Drum Cymbals Suspended cymbal

Sizzle cymbal Hi-hat Snare drum Triangle Tambourine Glockenspiel

Crotales Bell tree Claves

Castanets Sandpaper blocks Woodblocks (2)

Writing of divisi parts for strings is discouraged.
