CONCERT THEME

Holiday Pops features familiar musical selections from holiday and winter classics. The program features two guest soloists, one man and one woman. Some of the music featured is from the following beloved works: *The Nutcracker, Home Alone,* and *A Charlie Brown Christmas*. The concert starts with Waldteufel's *Les Patineurs*, a waltz that captures the magic of ice skating during wintertime.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Upon arrival, you will be offered a fidget and a map of the pre-concert activities around Heinz Hall. Earplugs will be available in the Grand Lobby (main floor), as well as in select locations around the hall. A Quiet Room will be available during the entire event in the Overlook Room (second floor), as a designated quiet space with relaxing activities and a live video feed of the performance. PSO staff, volunteers, and ushers will be available throughout the building to answer questions and provide additional assistance as requested.

- Patrons are welcome to change seats, moving further back or closer to the stage, based on their sensory preferences and needs
- Patrons are welcome to talk, clap, sing, dance, and move throughout the concert
- Designated quiet room with relaxing activities and live video feed of the stage is available for patrons who would like to take a break at any time during the concert
