Virtual Schoolttime

The Pittsburgh Symphony moved its popular Schoolttime program online during the 2020-2021 school year to connect with educators and students as they navigated changing learning environments due to COVID-19. Virtual Schoolttime provided six different music education units for students in grades PreK-12, offered at no cost for educators to use during remote, hybrid, and in-person instruction.


Each unit explored an essential question, included newly captured performances by PSO musicians, and shared additional resources for continued learning. Virtual Schoolttime reached students in 36 states, Canada, and Scotland, with over 150 schools across Southwest Pennsylvania participating.

Fidd Kits

Fiddlesticks brought the magic of music into children's homes across the country with the PSO's new product Fidd Kits. Each kit included a set of curated hands-on activities to explore a musical theme, arts and craft supplies, and a personalized letter from Fiddlesticks. Fidd Kits traveled far and wide during the 2020-2021 season, reaching families in 23 states, Washington D.C., Canada, and France. Closer to home, the PSO partnered with Pittsburgh Public Schools and Wilksburg School District to provide kits to 1,600 second and third grade students at no cost.

Sensory Friendly Holiday Concert

The PSO presented its second annual Sensory Friendly Holiday Concert in December. This year's experience was virtual and featured an adapted orchestra performance, printable art activities designed by local illustrator Emily Marko, and special holiday activity videos with local partners Wesley Family Services, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, Dream Big Studio, and the music therapy team at UPMC Children's Hospital. The PSO Accessibility Advisory Committee and occupational therapy expert Roger Ideishi guided the event's transition to a virtual space while ensuring an experience that was fun and accessible for all.

COMMENTS (shared by the PSO's consulting occupational therapy expert, from other therapists):

- Therapists told me they tried looking on various arts organization sites but it was mostly pay to gain access. They are very grateful to Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra for free access to this program.
- The therapist and a student were having a virtual session. They were watching the video of the holiday concert and looking at the sensory friendly instrument guide. The student with a developmental disability started talking about her sister who plays

the cello and how much this student likes music. The therapist didn't know much about the student's family. It started a whole conversation and activity around instruments and music that the therapist would not have discovered about this student if it weren't for the PSO materials.

- Another therapist watched the concert with another student with an intellectual disability. The student was commenting on how difficult it must be to breathe playing the trombone. The therapist then used this inquiry to have the student analyze how other instruments are played, working on the student's problem solving and attention skills (in his IEP) while intently watching the musicians play the various instruments.
